Maryland House Republican Caucus Announces Business Relief Package

The House Republican Caucus has announced a Business Relief Package of legislative initiatives to help Maryland businesses recover from the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Included in this package is Delegate Wayne Hartman-sponsored bill HB1176: Income Tax – Credit for Travel, Hospitality, and Entertainment Expenses. The bill will provide tax credits to individuals and families to cover expenses for travel to Maryland destinations or attend live entertainment and sporting events in Maryland. The expenses include food and beverages, lodging, and transportation costs. It also includes expenses related to attending live entertainment, sporting events, and attending conferences or business meetings. The travel has to take place in either 2021 or 2022 and must be at least 50 miles from an individual's residence. The tax credit is up to \$4,000 for individual filers and \$8,000 for married couples who file jointly, plus an additional \$500 for each dependent child. The tax credit program is capped at \$25 million per year.

OC Chamber Signs BridgeUSA Coalition Letter to Secretary of State Blinken Urging to Rescind Presidential Proclamation 10052 and Return to BridgeUSA Exchange Programs

The COVID-19 pandemic and Presidential Proclamation 10052 have greatly impacted BridgeUSA programs. The 2020 Summer Work Travel Program from May – September comprised 93% fewer participants than 2019 levels. When Proclamation 10052 is rescinded, the process of restoring confidence in these critical public diplomacy programs can begin again.
